Briefing Purpose

Update the California Water Commission on the State Water Project's Southern Hydropower Facilities Relicensing Efforts.



Why Relicense?

- Federal Power Act (FPA)
- Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) requirement to continue operating the project after the initial license terms expires on January 31, 2022
- To continue to provide affordable water supply, clean hydropower, opportunities to integrate green energy, accessible public recreation opportunities, and environmental benefits.



What Is Involved?

- Multi-year stakeholder driven process (initial Agency outreach started fall 2015)
- FERC "re-balances" the power and non-power beneficial uses of project
- Licensee
 - Gathers/presents all known information and performs studies to fill information gaps
 - Works with stakeholders to develop Protection, Mitigation, and Enhance measures (PM&E's) to address potential resource impacts
 - Performs all other required related regulatory processes (CEQA, ESA, Sec 106)





Stakeholder Engagement

- Broad stakeholder process starting fall 2015
- Much upfront effort in developing communication protocols, mail and e-mail lists, project website
- Many meetings, both public and with individual entities, FERCrequired and "above and beyond"

Key Stakeholders

- State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB)
 - Have mandatory conditioning authority related to water quality certification for the relicensing
- California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW)
 - Have authority to recommend measures to protect fish and wildlife resources of under FPA Section 10(j)
- United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)
 - Have authority to recommend measures to protect fish and wildlife resources under FPA Section 10(j); may include conditions for ESA-listed plants and animals under a biological opinion



DCP - Key Stakeholders (cont.)

- San Bernardino National Forest (SBNF)
 - can submit mandatory conditions to protect a federal reservation under FPA Section 4(e)
- San Manuel Band of Mission Indians and Morongo Band of Mission Indians
 - May include conditions under an historic properties management plan under NHPA Section 106
- Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR)
 - Operates Silverwood Lake SRA
- Pacific Crest Trail Association (PCTA)
 - Interested in issues that may affect the PCT



SSWP - Key Stakeholders (cont.)

- SSWP Angeles and Los Padres National Forests
 - Can submit mandatory conditions to protect a federal reservation under FPA Section 4(e)
- National Marine Fisheries Service
 - Have authority to recommend measures to protect fish resources under FPA Section 10(j);
 have authority to prescribe fishway passage under Section 18; may include conditions for ESA-listed anadromous fish under a biological opinion
- Morongo Band of Mission Indians, Fernandeño Tataviam Band of Mission Indians, and Tejon Indian Tribe
 - May include conditions under a historic properties management plan under NHPA Section
 106



DCP - Most Significant Stakeholder Concerns

Stakeholder	Specific Interests/Concerns
USFS	Impacts to USFS lands: "over flow" recreation (trash); visual impact of DCPP penstocks; potential upstream AIS impacts from fish stocking
PCTA	Visual impacts to PCT from Cedar Springs Dam, other recreation facilities/fencing
DPR	Funding for FERC- required recreation commitments

SWRCB	Meeting Pyramid Inflow/Outflow Requirements
NMFS	Fish Passage Meeting Pyramid Inflow/Outflow Requirements
FERC	Addressing Hardluck Removal Whitewater Boating Opportunities

Final License Application

DCP – Filed Nov. 2019

- SSWP Filed Jan. 2020
- Includes initial Preliminary Application Document and study information
- Provides applicant's analysis of the Project effects on the environment
- Addresses stakeholder comments on Draft License Application
- Opportunity for applicant to propose PM&E plans and measures:
 - Visual Resources Management Plan
 - Recreation Resources Plan
 - Aquatic Invasive Species Plan
 - Fire Prevention
 - Erosion & Sediment Control Plan

- Hazardous Materials
- Transportation Management Plan
- Integrated Vegetation
- Historic Properties Management Plan
- Fish Stocking
