


### OVERVIEW OF THE CALIFORNIA DAM SAFETY PROGRAM






### 1,239 Regulated Dams and Reservoirs















### **Dam Hazard Classifications and Owners**



#### 619 Dam Owners




### **Information Request**

The proposed regulations specify the Department's process for requesting information from dam owners, or suspected dam owners, about dam:

- Ownership
- Construction
- Operation
- Maintenance

#### **Administrative Civil Penalties**

Deters Owner from Additional Violations


Deters Regulated Community

# **Public Comment Periods**

#### 55-day public comment period – Initial Text (May 21 – Jul. 15, 2021)

- Four (4) emails/letters received
  - Seventeen (17) comments
- Comments provided by four (4) individuals at public hearing (July 12, 2021)
  - Eleven (11) comments

#### 19-day public comment period – Modified Text (Aug. 19 – Sept. 2021)

- August 19, 2021 September 7, 2021
- One (1) email/letter received
  - Four (4) comments

#### 16-day public comment period – Modified Text (Jun. 20 – Jul. 6, 2022)

One comment provided after the comment period had ended



# **Final Regulations for Approval**

Noteworthy Modifications to Text since October 2021:

#### Revised the usage of "may" to "shall" in many instances.

- As an example, in section 337.62 of the proposed regulations, the language was changed from "may" to "shall" when setting forth how the "total base penalty" is adjusted.
- "<u>The department may**shall** adjust the total base penalty</u> considering each of the following adjustment factors:"

 Removed provisions for reimbursement of Department costs for enforcement.



# **Final Regulations for Approval**

Noteworthy Clarifications to Text since October 2021:

- Clarified who would be subject to information requests and how a suspected dam would be determined.
- Added clarifying criteria that will be considered when "may" is used in the regulation text.
  - For example: When determining whether to issue a Notice of Violation under section 337.4 of the proposed regulations, "<u>DSOD</u> will consider the nature of the violation, potential threat to life and property posed by the violation, and the number of violations that would be included in a Notice of Violation."





January 2023 (tentative)	Begin Implementing Enforcement Actions
