



OVERVIEW OF THE CALIFORNIA DAM SAFETY PROGRAM







1,239 Regulated Dams and Reservoirs












Earth Rockfill Dams

Information Request

The proposed regulations specify the Department's process for requesting information from dam owners, or suspected dam owners, about dam:

- Ownership
- Construction
- Operation
- Maintenance

Administrative Civil Penalties

Aligns Violation to Actual or Potential Public Harm

Deters Owner from Additional Violations

Deters Regulated Community

Eliminates Non-Compliance Economic Advantage

Key Comments and Responses



Public Comment Periods

55-day public comment period – Initial Text

- May 21, 2021 July 15, 2021
- Four (4) emails/letters received
 - Seventeen (17) comments
- Comments provided by four (4) individuals at public hearing (July 12, 2021)
 - Eleven (11) comments

19-day public comment period – Modified Text

- August 19, 2021 September 7, 2021
- One (1) email/letter received
 - Four (4) comments



Key Comments Summarized

Key comments incorporated into the regulation:

- Provide more than twenty (20) days for a dam owner to request a hearing following the issuance of a Notice of Violation.
- Leaving documents (service) at the dam site with a person over the age of 18 should only be considered if all other options are unavailable.
- Provide further clarity regarding penalties.



Key Comments Summarized

Key comments considered, with <u>no</u> resulting changes:

- Consider that a dam owner is being cooperative or acting in "Good Faith" when considering enforcement actions.
- Provide additional information as to why the Department would send an information request.
- Consider impacts to electricity rates in the determination monetary civil administrative penalties.



Final Regulations for Approval

Modifications to Text:

- Increased the time period for requesting a hearing, following the issuance of a Notice of Violation, from twenty (20) to thirty (30) days.
- Modified language regarding the methods of service that the Department would employ, specifically leaving documents at the dam site with a person over the age of 18, should only be considered if other options are unavailable.
- Removed revocation of certificate of approval as an enforcement action.
- Added provision on establishing appropriate punitive reservoir restrictions.



Final Regulations for Approval

Clarifications to Text:

- Clarified that enforcement actions regarding emergency action plans include both the initial submittals and updates (required every 10 years by statute).
- Added a section on how punitive reservoir restrictions will be established versus reservoir restrictions imposed as a risk-reduction measure for dam safety.



Next Steps

Month	Planned Actions
October	Seek California Water Commission Approval of Regulations
November	Submit final rulemaking package to the Office of Administrative Law
December (tentative)	Adopt Approved Regulations
January 2022 (tentative)	Begin Implementing Enforcement Actions
