FY 21-22 AND FY 22-23 WATER RESILIENCE AND DROUGHT PACKAGES

- Received over \$300 million with focus in these key areas:
 - Terrestrial and Aquatic Rescues and Monitoring
 - 2. Hatchery Improvements and Fish Production
 - 3. Habitat Restoration and Fish Passage
 - 4. Water Operations and Permitting
 - 5. Drought resiliency on State-owned and Partnership Lands
 - 6. Human-Wildlife Conflict Response
 - 7. Law Enforcement



CDFW DROUGHT RESPONSE — FISHERIES, WATER OPERATIONS AND PERMITTING



- Recreational fishing
 - Extended low-flow closure season
 - "Hoot Owl" water watchlist
- Fish Rescues
 - 89 rescues, 51 waters, 28,090 fish, 22 species (As of 1/9/23. Source: https://wildlife.ca.gov/dought)
 - Relocation of winter-run Chinook
- Water Operations
 - Voluntary Drought Agreements
 - SWRCB action review and coordination
 - e.g. Instream Flow Requirements variance requests, Curtailments, Temporary Urgency Change Petitions, etc.



CDFW Drought Response — Hatcheries

- Infrastructure Upgrades
 - New tanks, water recirculation systems, chillers, backup generators
- Trucked juvenile CV Chinook salmon to bays
 - 2021 16.8 million
 - 2022 19.7 million
- Increased CV Chinook salmon production
 - 2021 2.25 million
 - 2022 3.5 million
- Relocation of Iron Gate (Klamath R) and Warm Springs (Russian R) hatchery fish due to warm temps





CDFW DROUGHT RESPONSE — WILDLIFE AND LANDS



- Infrastructure improvements at our Wildlife Areas
 - Increase wetland carrying capacity & efficiency in water conveyance
 - New Equipment
- Translocations and captive rearing of amphibians, reptiles, etc.
- Guzzler refill for Bighorn Sheep and other wildlife
- Increased injured wildlife care and human/wildlife conflict

Drought Response – Law Enforcement

- Overtime work related to drought
 - Poaching
 - Streambed alteration violations
 - Forensic analysis
 - Data collection
- Updated Forensic equipment
- Drones for monitoring



WORKING WITH OTHER AGENCIES

- Resources Agency
 - Drought Budget Change Proposal Development
- DWR
 - Winter-run Chinook Salmon Reintroduction
 - Increased fish production at Feather River Fish Hatchery
 - Bid 4 Birds migratory waterfowl habitat program
 - CVP/SWP Temporary Urgency Change Petition
- SWRCB
 - Provided technical guidance on:
 - Variance Requests
 - Curtailments







Working with Partner Organizations





- Funded over 50 projects so far on:
 - Fish passage improvements
 - Flow enhancements
 - Habitat restoration
 - Increased waterfowl habitat
 - Monitoring
 - Scientific Studies
 - Genetics, pathogen, food ecology, etc.
- Many more in the works
