



- Drinking Water Assistance
- Emergency Curtailments
- Water Conservation
- Financial Assistance
- Drought Planning





Drinking Water Assistance

Safe & Affordable Funding for Equity & Resilience (SAFER) Drinking Water Program

- \$50 million emergency funding (10,000 households & 150 water systems)
- \$700 million for small disadvantaged community projects
- Improvements for 650,000 people and 120 communities
- Consolidated 80 water systems (210 in progress)

Since SAFER began in 2019






Emergency Curtailments

Implement priority system while protecting fish, wildlife, & human health & safety.

- Good for one year (2021 & 2022)
- Requires emergency proclamation and e-reg
- Exemptions for human health & safety
- Voluntary solutions
- Enforcement





Water Conservation

Fastest, cheapest & easiest way to stretch water supplies

- Voluntary 15% conservation (Jul 2021)
- Emergency wasteful water use prohibitions (Jan 2022)
- Emergency water demand reduction (Jul 2022)
- Water loss prevention standards (Oct 2022)






Financial Assistance

\$3.3 billion to communities to boost drought resilience and increase water supplies (FY 21/22)

- \$1.2 billion for recycled water projects
- \$26 million for emergency projects
- \$984 million for drinking water construction projects
- \$1.1 billion for wastewater & stormwater projects





Drought Planning

Water Supply Strategy sets goals for recycled water, storm water, desalination, and groundwater recharge

- Recycled Water Strike Team (Jan 2023)
- Storm Water Project (early-2024)
- Desalination Interagency Group (Oct 2022)
- Groundwater Recharge Permit Prioritization (ongoing)
- Conservation & Water Rights Modernization
