In this report, appreciate including the following footnotes and definitions:

Page 7 - footnote

3 "Tribes" refers to California Native American Tribes. In the State of California, this includes both federally and non-federally recognized Tribes.

Page 19 - footnotes

10 This includes Tribal Allotees. Tribal allotment landowners are underserved communities that do not receive any major funding for safe drinking water and wastewater systems.

11 "Tribal lands" includes Tribal reservations, rancherias, villages, colonies, and allotments, and are based on available data with permission from affiliated Tribes

Main text includes the focus of "Tribal Lands" on state maps: Page 19 -

f. Further a better understanding of Tribal water needs and consider including Tribal lands (11) on State maps of hydrological regions.

I still recommend that CA DWR sponsored 2023 Tribal Water Summit would be referenced in this report and some of the report related outcomes/recommendations from this Summit be included in this report. There were so many very important and

innovative Tribal ideas regarding preparedness for future droughts, lessons learn form past droughts, and use of Tribal Ecological Knowledge.
