



Dos Rios & Hidden Valley Ranch

Improving flood conveyance, habitat, recreation

(River Partners, Ducks Unlimited, American Rivers, Tuolumne River Trust, Trout Unlimited & Agency Partners)

More than 1,000 acres at the confluence of the Tuolumne & San Joaquin River, adjacent to SJR Wildlife Refuge

Will absorb est. 10,000 acre feet of flood water on fish & wildlife habitat, reducing downstream peak stage and flood damage to communities




