



**Briefing on California EcoRestore by California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA)
Director of Ecosystem Restoration David Okita**

Background

California EcoRestore is a state initiative aimed at advancing critical habitat restoration in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Through the program, the state plans to pursue a broad range of habitat restoration projects across at least 30,000 acres of land in the Delta. California EcoRestore aims to address the legacy impacts of historical human intervention in the Delta, as well as ongoing impacts from operation of the State Water Project and Central Valley Project. The initial goal of California EcoRestore is to advance 25,000 acres associated with existing habitat restoration requirements, pursuant to federal biological opinions, and 5,000 acres of habitat enhancements.

At this meeting, David Okita, CNRA Director of Ecosystem Restoration, will provide an overview of California EcoRestore and discuss progress made to date. This is an informational item.
