



WSIP Technical Presentation: Relative Environmental Values

Background

The California Water Commission is developing the Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP) and regulations for the quantification and management of the public benefits of water storage projects in order to implement Chapter 8 of Proposition 1. Proposition 1 requires the WSIP regulations to include the Relative Environmental Values of Ecosystem Benefits as provided by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and the Relative Environmental Values of Water Quality Benefits as provided by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) (Water Code Section 79754).

At this meeting, CDFW staff will provide an overview of how they will determine the Relative Environmental Value of Ecosystem Benefits of proposed projects and State Water Board staff will provide an overview of how they will determine the Relative Environmental Value of Water Quality Benefits of proposed projects. This is an informational item.
