## **Water Storage Investment Program: Application Walk-Through and Quantification Example Webinar**

**SACRAMENTO-** The [California Water Commission](http://www.water.ca.gov) (Commission) is hosting a webinar for potential applicants of the Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP) on April 27, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

The application period is currently open and lasts through August 14, 2017. Staff of the Commission, the Department of Water Resources, the State Water Resources Control Board, and the Department of Fish and Wildlife will be available to answer questions.
